As the Explorers have become more inquisitive and enjoy asking lots of exciting questions we are reading more stories together in the class and I am asking the children what they think of the characters and if they can remember what happened in the stories.

We will also be finishing off our topic of habitats with learning about creatures we find under the sea and in the artic.

This week we have begun looking at different insects in particular the caterpillar and the butterfly, and we are reading The Very Hungry Caterpillar story. We enjoy during our outdoor time to find all different types of insects and we are taking care of the flowers and plants for them.

The weather is warming up and we have been having more water play and splash fun, and the children have enjoyed running and laughing together and melting the ice with the flowers and animals inside. We will continue to have these water days at the end of the week so a reminder to bring in waterproof clothing and a towel.

The children are so independent in the Explorers class and they enjoy being given little jobs and tasks. They enjoy opening and closing their own snack bags and taking off their own shoes and socks, although we are still working on putting our shoes and socks back on. They even help each other if they are unable to open their own water bottles or take off their shoes.
