In May, we will be digging deeper into How We Express Ourselves. We will be talking about what sort of things make us happy, sad and angry. We will also be learning about rectangles where we will go on a rectangle hunt around the school and see how many different objects are rectangular. Since the songs we incorporated into our circle time routine were such a huge hit, we will be adding more songs to build oral muscles to encourage and improve communication and language skills. We will also be talking about brushing our teeth so it would be highly appreciated if you could practice this with them.

The Little Explorers have had an amazing start to their third and final term of school. We have been extremely busy making creative Ramadan and Earth Day crafts to decorate around the school. We have been touching up on our colours which they are really quite familiar with now and have painted a beautiful rainbow. We have been learning about big and small circles. They all love and recognise our circle song and can draw huge circles in the air! Our Unit of Inquiry for April was How We Express Ourselves. The children learned about emotions such as being happy, being sad and being angry. The Little Explorers have also developed a good understanding of taking turns with their classmates and will wait patiently. Coach Lynn always challenges the children and has begun to incorporate a sequence of exercises for the children to do in order. They have been doing forward and backward rolls with her help and have really improved on the balancing beams.
